

Cleabarrow

Cleabarrow is a WADAA members-only fishery.

Fishery rules

Season - Cleabarrow fishery is open throughout 12 months of the year, seven days a week.

Opening hours - Daytime fishing is permitted from one hour before sunrise until one hour after sunset. It is the responsibility of anglers to establish the time of sunrise/sunset on the day, should they plan to arrive early or stay late.

WADAA members only are permitted to night fish, subject to prior arrangement. Night fishing must be booked with the club's Administrative Officer 72 hours in advance. A maximum of three members per night will be allowed (excluding accompanied juniors and non-fishing guests) these must be included in your bookings. Night fishing is only allowed from the prepared bivvy platforms. No booking of consecutive nights.

No litter at all, this includes cigarette butt's, teabags and fishing line.

No fish to be removed or killed.

Carp angling

A maximum of 2 rods may be used at any one time. Rods must be no more than 3 metres apart.

No baited rod(s) to be left unattended at any time when bait(s) are in the water, or out of the water (to protect wildlife).

Braided mainline is not permitted

Minimum of 12lb mainline to be used when targeting carp.

No leaders but rig tubing OK.

Sensible rigs must be used. In the event of a line break the lead must be able to free itself from the rest of the terminal tackle.

Only fishing bivvies or shelters are acceptable. No tents allowed

No nuts to be used as bait.

Only barbless or micro barbed hooks are allowed.

Unhooking mats must be used when targeting carp.

The use of carp sacks is forbidden.

The use of carp care kits is encouraged.

Silver Fish & other

A maximum of 2 rods to be used at any one time.

No baited rods to be left unattended at ANY time in or out of the water.

Hooks under size 12 must be barbless.

No keepnets to be used, unless an organised match is taking place.

Lure fishing is permitted, but only with a single barbless hook.
